Our Goals for Student Achievement

Clayton County District Goals

By 2023, Clayton County Public Schools will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Proficient and/or Distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones to at least 80% in each content area.

Hawthorne Elementary Goals

KK-2nd Grade

By the end of the school year, all students will increase reading comprehension by analyzing text to make inferences, draw conclusions, and increase written communication by explaining mathematical thinking to find solutions as measured by selected school-wide and system-wide assessments.

3rd-5th Grade

Hawthorne will provide rigor and relevance focused lessons to promote language/vocabulary development for **ALL** students and continued implementation of the high performance teaching model during the literacy block to include mini-lessons on crafting arguments, information/ explanatory, and narrative writing and applying conventions to reach the goal of students scoring at the Proficient and/or Distinguished levels on the Georgia Milestones to at least 80% in each content area.

Hawthorne Title 1 Students

Hawthorne students joined the staff to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Read for 20 minutes each day
- Reminder for parents about assignments, projects, and activities at school
- Review vocabulary words daily

- Weekly Communication
- Daily homework to reinforce Language Arts and Math skills.
- Differentiated homework, classwork and assessment data.
- Inform families of the Georgia Standards of Excellence in all content areas.
- Offer on-going Reading and Math activities and workshops for families.

Parent and Students Working Together for Success

At Home

The Hawthorne parents realize that their child's school years are more than important. They also understand that they are their child's first teacher. Participation in their child's education will not only help his/her academic achievement, but will directly impact his/her growth and attitude. The parents agree to carry out the following responsibilities:

- Incorporate opportunities to utilize Language Arts and Math skills for students (i.e. during conversations, in the grocery store, daily conversations, etc.)
